Offshoring quantified

The U.S. Labor Department today released [the first official numbers](#) on how many American jobs have been lost to overseas outsourcing.

Bottom line: Out of the 239,361 non-agricultural, private-sector jobs lost in the first quarter of 2004, a total of 4,633 were associated with "the movement of work outside of the country," according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics' preliminary data. Another 9,985 jobs were lost to "domestic relocation of work."

As Reuters [sums it up](#):

The bulk of outsourced jobs never leave U.S. shores, the government said on Thursday in a new report suggesting concerns over American workers losing jobs to cheaper foreign labor may be exaggerated.

The Associated Press [notes](#) that "the Labor Department figures aren't comprehensive. They only include layoffs at companies employing 50 workers or more, where at least 50 people filed for unemployment benefits during a five-week period and were out of work for more than 30 days. About a third of all mass layoffs extend for more than 30 days, the report said."
